INTRODUCTION

This booklet has been designed for use in personal devotion time or as a guide for family worship. It contains a combination of the following six elements: Praise, Hymn, Scripture Reading, Confession of Sin, Assurance of Forgiveness, and Response. In the Scripture reading for this booklet, we are continuing the first quarter's readings which will, by the time we finish, will fulfill a Bible-in-one-year plan.

The overall goal of this booklet is to encourage Christian spiritual formation; this is accomplished, with the help of the Holy Spirit, through reading Scripture, reading and praying the prayers and hymns of Christian fathers and other heroes of the faith, and actively responding to what has been read with the aid of written prompts. Blank space is provided for journaling, observations on the text, prayer requests, answered prayers, and noting "God-winks," or themes and ideas God seems to be drawing your attention to. It is our prayer that hearts are transformed into the likeness of Christ as we read, pray, study, and respond to His Word.

Please note: The title of this booklet, "Love's Redeeming Work is Done," is taken from a verse in the hymn "Christ the Lord is Risen Today." This hymn is the hymn associated with this quarter's booklet. Though it is not an assigned element in any of the days, the hope is that, when you have time, you will sing this hymn as part of your devotional time with the Lord. The hymnal page is included in the back of this booklet.
